President's Report
Nathan Poore, Kennebunkport

Dear MTCMA Members,

It has been an honor to serve as your president during the past year. The rewards have far outpaced the investment of my time and I am especially thankful for having an opportunity to make so many friends with people who were formerly a simple acquaintance. Although my appreciation to Joan and Margaret may sound like plagiarism from previous year reports, it needs to be said again – they are the backbone of our organization and deserve an enormous pat on the back.

As in previous years, the Board of Directors met in the late spring of 2005 to evaluate prior/current year progress and to develop goals and strategies for the incoming leadership. I am happy to report that we have met many of our goals and hope to complete all unfinished business by Institute in August.

MTCMA Goals – 2005

- Increase member participation in program evaluation processes.
 - Evaluate member satisfaction through a survey.
 - Improve MTCMA professional development opportunities at the MMA annual convention.
 - Build a resource area on the Website - posting policies and ordinances. (Note: this task should continue if we want our Website to be a valuable resource.)
 - Move the location of the winter interchange to different geographical locations.
 - Increase the value and participation in our certification program. (Note: there were 25 certifications awarded at the 2005 Institute and the Board has committed to an additional 50 certifications by the 2006 Institute.)
 - Start a Website vendor/contractor sponsorship program which will increase revenues and provide a resource to members when contemplating RFP and RFQ processes.
 - Enhance the Range Rider program by expanding the role of the Range Riders. We will be proposing a bylaw amendment at 2006 Institute that will add a retired manager to the Board of Directors who will be the de facto Range Rider Chair. This will improve communication between the Board and Range Riders and ultimately enhance the program, which will bring additional resources/services to the membership.

These goals, most met and some ongoing, add a tremendous amount of value to our organization. To realize this value, members must participate as an active member or even as a member of the Board of Directors. Taking time out of the office is sometimes seen as an insurmountable task given the challenges of our

profession, but we must make an effort to learn new tasks, hone in on others and share our theories and proposals with other managers. An MTCMA member can gain much from attending the sessions developed by the Professional Development Committee. Serving on the Board of Directors is another option, and in this case the time spent working on the Board is an excellent opportunity to contribute to our organization while learning more about the profession. I encourage new and veteran managers to get involved, stay sharp, and realize that stepping out of the office is not only possible but also absolutely necessary.

Finally, I need to thank the other officers and members of the Board of Directors – you had an aggressive list of tasks and you more than met the challenge. I look forward to seeing everyone at the 2006 Institute.

Professional Development Committee

As the Chair of the Professional Development Committee, I first want to thank the members of the committee who offered their ideas and assistance in providing some excellent training opportunities.

I am pleased to see the Manager Certification process was revamped to be more focused and meaningful, requiring certain training hours in each of several important managerial specialty areas.

The use of sponsors to keep our training opportunities plentiful and our costs reduced continues to work well. Thanks Ruth for being our go-to person on sponsorships.

We also worked with the Web Page Committee to finalize rules and layout and pricing to begin to draw in revenue through our vendors advertising on our www.mtcma.com web page. Again, these revenues can be used to offset speaker costs, to expand the Range Rider program, or to offer more or bigger scholarships to would-be public administrators still in college.

As occurred in 2005, I hope we continue to make the MMA convention a primary training opportunity by designing our own programs. We emphasized “take home” ideas and tools. For the first time, we provided attendees a CD of sample policies, which seemed to be well received.

Had we not been snowed out, we would have achieved the goal of putting on direct training at the MMA Convention, plus 3 others, plus the Institute; a total of 5 solid learning opportunities annually.

Summary of Training

2005 MMA Annual Convention: Hosted two sessions: The first was on the elements and choices that need to be considered when developing a Personnel Policy. The other session was a panel discussion about the various elements and choices within municipal Financial and Investment Policies.

December Winter Interchange: We sponsored an Ethics Workshop where a National League of Cities Ethics expert was coming in to discuss practical and everyday situations which may run counter to the Code of Ethics. It got snowed out. It is recommended that this be re-scheduled for the 2006 MMA Convention.

March Spring Interchange: MTCMA sponsored training on Holding Effective Meetings and Effectively Engaging Citizens. This training had to do with marketing to get people to meetings; effectively utilizing the press to carry your message and how to then better engage the public once you have their attention.

May Workshop: MTCMA sponsored a joint meeting with MFCA and MBOIA about Important Fire and Code Issues in Maine, which included the onset of residential sprinkler requirements, code conflicts, and the recruitment and retention of volunteer fire and rescue personnel in these times of added mandates, training and record-keeping.

Ethics Committee Report

During the past year, the Ethics Committee has been busy and active serving our association. We deliberated over two separate ethics issues involving three members of our organization. One issue that keeps popping up among our membership is that of endorsements. The ICMA guideline for Tenet #12 for endorsements states that:

“Endorsements. Members should not endorse commercial products or services by agreeing to use their photograph, endorsement, or quotation in paid or other commercial advertisements, whether or not for compensation. Members may, however, agree to endorse the following, provided they do not receive any compensation: (1) books or other publications; (2) professional development or educational services provided by nonprofit membership organizations or recognized educational institutions; (3) products and/or services in which the local government has a direct economic interest.”

Please take note of this guideline and be careful to review requests from vendors for how letters of recommendation for the products and services we buy will be used.

The Ethics Committee will be developing a procedure for handling ethics inquiries and complaints that are similar to ICMA’s process, but better tailored for Maine managers.

The Ethics Committee meets when needed to answer an inquiry or complaint and hopes not to meet in the upcoming year.

Thank you for the honor of serving our association as the Chair of the Ethics Committee. Thanks to the membership, the Board of Directors and to our President, Nathan Poore for a real supportive year. I would also like to thank committee members Bill Bridgeo, Scott Harriman, Dave Morton, Dana Reed, Terry St. Peter and John Simko for their interest and support. Last, but certainly not least, I would like to thank the MMA staff and especially Joan Kiszely, Margaret Langhill, Lesley Mosher and Jaime Clark for all they do to make our lives and jobs easier.

Institute Committee

The 2006 New England Management Institute will be held August 30 - September 1, 2006 at Sebasco Harbor Resort. The program content is being developed by the Muskie School of Public Service (USM) and the New England Environmental Finance Center. The program pulls components from the NEEFC's "Next Communities Initiative". (To review more details, check - <http://efc.muskie.usm.maine/tools/html>).

The Next Communities Initiative is built out an effort to help communities, citizens, and civic leaders to more intelligently and wisely guide growth in a way that fights "sprawl" while promoting community consensus and respecting private interests. The Institute program will fast forward through the principals of "smart growth" and the structures, constraints, politics of growth. The program will concentrate its focus on the management of change, and conflict and provides managers with tools and insights for collaborative decision-making.

This will be a highly interactive program, with lots of opportunities for participants to share their experiences, place themselves in the shoes of the developer, the neighbor, and the planner. The skills and insights offered will relate not only to sprawl and growth issues - but will offer managers options for dealing with all sorts of community conflicts and decisions - budgets, capital investment plans, difficult sitting issues for public projects, tax policy debates.

It is said that when all you own is a hammer, everything looks like a nail. This workshop is intended to help you see that not all issues are nails, and that you have more tools than just a hammer.

Friday morning, Dana Lee will lead a discussion on a life of public service and the lessons learned from years of being pounded like a nail himself. Dana is leaving the municipal management profession behind (temporarily, we hope), but you are sure to discover that you can take Dana Lee out of public service - but you can't take public service out of Dana.

Plan to stay for Friday's session for fun, insights into "life on the outside," and why, after all is said and done, what you do really is worth the effort.

Communications Committee Report – 2006 Stu Marckoon, Chair

When thinking back to 1993 when first joining the MTCMA, communication between town managers came either by a telephone call to a neighboring community, a letter between managers, or a chance meeting, usually at an MTCMA sponsored function. The bigger communities had access to a fax machine. Most towns used a computer of some sort, but it was mainly for inter office word processing and accounting functions.

Today, thanks to advances in technology, our organization now enjoys almost instant, widespread communication. Instead of \$2,000 for a computer with 20-megabytes of storage space, we can now buy an infinitely faster model with 200-gigabytes of space for a quarter of the price. Communication hookups transmit data among our members at incredible speed.



If a member has a question, post it to the list-serve and get an answer almost instantly from someone who's got some experience or came up with a solution to a similar problem.

I've been proud to "chair" the communications committee for the past two years. The only problem has been that nobody else has communicated a desire to serve on the committee. The Executive Board, though, has been very good at providing input. As you can see from the snapshot of the front page of our website, (www.mtcma.org) there's a lot going on with our members and our organization as a whole. This year we added sponsorships on our website,

and several members have succeeded in hooking up vendors with an ad space on our site. This will help increase scholarships and defray other costs to the organization.

We've also made strides in gathering various documents such as contracts and ordinances from our members and placing them into a resource library, adding to the one started years ago. Many thanks to the members who've taken the time to provide those, both in response to my requests and those on the list-serve.

The website and list-serve continue to be our major line of communication, and it's very effective. I caution, though, that it will never replace the one-on-one conversation between managers. You can't put facial expressions, voice tones, and other body language into a computer file. So continue the electronics, but don't forget to be up close and personal. Any input you have – please communicate it!
